Ash Wednesday: Wednesday next 5<sup>th</sup> March is Ash Wednesday. It is the beginning of the Season of Lent, a time of Reflection, renewals and repentance in preparation for the Great Christian Feast of Easter. Ashes will be blessed at the 10am mass in Clarecastle on Wednesday morning. Ashes will be blessed in Ballyea at 8pm mass on Wednesday evening. There will be mass in Clarecastle also on Ash Wednesday evening at 7pm. Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence, one of two during the Lenten Season, the second being Good Friday. The obligation to fast is for all between the ages of 18 to 59 who are in good health. Those who have medical conditions between these ages are not obliged to fast. People over the age of 60 can do so at there own discretion and without any obligation. The obligation to abstain from eating meat on the two days of abstinence falls to all from the age of 14 onwards.

**Lenten Masses:** There will be an evening mass in Ballyea Church on the Fridays of Lent. On Friday next 7<sup>th</sup> March which is a First Friday mass will be at 8pm. It will be the Month's Mind mass for the late Annie Wall nee McInerney Barnageeha, Darragh, who died last month and was our oldest parishioner.

Every other Friday evening during Lent the mass will be at 7pm in Ballyea. Please note the time change. This mass is offered on an attendance basis and if there is a poor turnout we will cease to offer it. The change from 8pm to 7pm is due to poor attendance at 8pm in previous years and the expressed view that 7pm may suit people better at this time of year. We will give it a try.
